AusGOAL

- copyright and CC training and training materials, (AusGOAL endorsed the CC v4.0 Licences in February 2014)
- provide policy and legal advice,
- support the NCU to implement 'open' in education,
- provide high level guidance and advice to government and the publicly funded research sector on all aspects of open access and licensing,
- perform any other role and activity consistent with the AusGOAL Board's instructions.

- 6. Deliver a series of workshops to Departments of Education, Catholic Education Offices and Associations of Independent Schools e learning and curriculum areas re how to find OER and creating OER for the Australian schools sector
- 7. Deliver workshops, seminars and presentations to Australian Schools and TAFEs.
- 8. Continuing to advise and work with ESA, ACARA and AITSIL to promote AusGOAL and CC/OER
- 9. Faciliate and lead Copyright4Educators course on P2PU- www.p2pu.org and develop an Australian version of CC for Educators.
- 10. Liaise where appropriate with tertiary institutions and RTOs re adoption of CC and OER
- 11. Encourage the adoption of Version 4.0 to the education sector

QUT

Education, community building, and outreach

- Review and update the CC Australia fact sheets produced and maintained by QUT
- Create new copyright information fact sheets (6 x sector specific creators and users; 6 x limitations and exceptions; 5 x general information)
- Re-establish connections with adopters in private sector & GLAM
- Work with Universities to develop best practices for open licensing (OA, OER, Free Software)
- Provide support for Open Access to Scholarly Communications (particularly via University library sector)
- Re-design website (audit existing information; analytics and visitor flow optimisation)
- Develop and implement social media and comms strategy (Bledsoe)
- Establish workflows and source updates from community for steady communications through distinct channels
- Respond to public enquiries; directing to appropriate contacts to respond.

Advocacy

Continue to support 'Fair Use alliance' & engage as appropriate

- Continue engaging with advocacy and support for Open Access, Open Data, OER as appropriate
- Continue advocacy in removing barriers between collecting societies and CC (particularly APRA/AMCOS/PPCA) - excluding government or education sector arrangements with Collecting Societies.

Research

- Develop updated case studies from existing adopters
- Continue research on open business models and mechanisms to support open production
- Work towards development of an empirical model for policy analysis that enables counterfactual testing and optimisation of different incentives across different industries.
